



Memorandum of Agreement between The Catholic University of America Press (CUAP) and the American Catholic Historical Association (ACHA) regarding *The Catholic Historical Review* (CHR), the official organ of the ACHA.

Building on a relationship that spans almost one hundred years between the ACHA and The Catholic University of America, this memorandum of agreement confirms this unique relationship.

CUAP, publisher of *The Catholic Historical Review*, hereby agrees to provide all members of the ACHA with access to electronic copies of the *CHR* on a quarterly basis via *Project Muse* as well as all issues of the journal that are available via that electronic portal, gratis. Furthermore, CUAP will offer print copies of the *CHR* to ACHA members at the base price of ten dollars (\$10.00) a copy (effective Winter/January 2014 issue).

Financial agreements for the cost of print copies will be re-evaluated on an annual basis by CUAP. Any price increase, however, will be no more than two-thirds (67%) of the cost charged for regular, or individual, subscriptions.

On a quarterly basis, the editor of the *CHR* will provide the ACHA Executive Secretary with a pull copy of the current table of content for posting on the ACHA website.

When an issue of the journal is to be mailed, the Executive Secretary of the ACHA will provide CUAP with a mailing list of all those members who are to receive a print copy of the *CHR*.

On an annual basis, normally late September, the ACHA will provide an updated listing of its Executive Council to the editor of the *CHR* for inclusion on the inside front cover of the journal.

On an annual basis, the editor of the *CHR* will publish in the April/Spring issue of the journal the Presidential address that was delivered at the ACHA luncheon held in January of that year.

On an annual basis, the ACHA will provide, and the editor of the *CHR* will publish in the Spring/April issue of the journal, a list and narrative of the book prize winners (e.g., Shea, Marraro, Koenig), the dissertation award recipient (Ellis prize), and the journal article (Guilday) winner as well as the Distinguished Scholarship, Teaching, and Service Award recipients.

This Agreement will be in effect for ten (10) years from the date of full execution. Any addendums or alterations to this Agreement must be approved by two-thirds (67%) of the ACHA's Executive Council and be in a writing executed by the ACHA and CUAP in order to be effective.
